Virtual programs allow the participation of non-traditional and underrepresented students. It also offers programs in locations where you cannot send students physically.

Increase program offerings that include culturally relevant themes to historically marginalized student groups.

3

Extend the benefits of international education to non-traditional students outside of university settings. For example, offering virtual study abroad programs for incarcerated students would be a way to open up the world to those who have been shut off from it in nearly every other way.
